Course Description:

During Ninth Grade English we will read many examples of excellent literature and informational text. We will study the major types literature: short stories, novels, poetry, drama, epic poetry, and literary non-fiction. We will discuss and write about the works we read, we will memorize poems and write speeches, and we will deliver presentations about what we have learned. Ninth Grade English will prepare you for your future high school and college English classes as you become proficient in focused literary study.

Course Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, you will be able to:

- Become proficient in analyzing **short stories** using literary concepts (characterization, setting, plot elements, figurative language, theme, symbolism, sensory imagery, style, point of view, etc.)
- Become proficient in analyzing **novels** (historical context impact, major/minor characters and characterization techniques, multiple plot relationships, point of view impact, etc.)
- Become proficient in analyzing **poems** (poetry forms & characteristics, rhyme, meter, poetic devices, how theme is revealed, etc.)
- Become proficient in analyzing **dramas** (elements of drama, plot structure, dramatic techniques, character development, comedy, tragedy, irony, etc.)
- Become proficient in analyzing **epic poetry** (elements of epic poetry, characteristics of a hero, relationship to myths, historical context, themes, etc.)
- Become proficient in analyzing literary non-fiction (types of essays, rhetorical strategies in speeches, characteristics of memoirs, characteristics of autobiographies, etc.)
- Continue to hone skills in **writing essays**: argumentative and informative
- Continue to hone skills in **writing narratives**
- Continue to hone skills in **oral presentations** and **group discussions**
- Continue to expand **vocabulary** & **grammatical** knowledge and application
